1 Introduction

The MVS access method is a module which implements the recio [1] provider interface allowing the recio user interface to support fixed and variable length record files implemented on MVS systems.

2 Open String Specification

As with all recio library open specification strings, three components comprise the open string: access method, object, and option name-value pairs.

2.1 Open Specification Access Method Name

The access method name should be specified as MVS.

2.2 Open Specification Object Name

The object name defines a file on an MVS system using a standard JCL DD statement without the DD name portion. The access method will determine the DD name, allocate the file and call the underlying access method.

2.3 Open Specification Option Name-Value Pairs

Consult the access method definition file for the option name-value pairs supported by the MVS access method. The access method definition file also supplies details of the default values (if any) of the options.

2.4 Open String Specification Examples

The commands below may be split over several lines; this is only for readability within this document. Normally all open string specifications are one continuous string.

Note also that in some instances the 'with' option's value is enclosed in brackets. This enables a value to have special characters (for example the delimiter comma or another equal sign), but still be recognised as a single token. For more information see the Recio User Guide: recio.pdf.

The following open string specification could be used to open a file as a text record delimited file.

```
"mvs([DSN=CODEMAGUS.A1.SOURCE(PROGRAMA),DISP=SHR], using=text,with=[mode=r])"
```

The following open string specification could be used to open a file as a fixed length record file.

```
"mvs([DSN=CODEMAGUS.A1.DATAFILE,DISP=SHR],
    using=binary,
    with=[mode=[rb,type=record],recfm=f,reclen=256,type=record])"
```

The following open string specification could be used to open a file as a variable length record file.

```
"mvs([DSN=CODEMAGUS.A2.DATAFILE,DISP=SHR],
    using=binary,
    with=[mode=[rb,type=record],recfm=v,type=record])"
```

The following open string specification could be used to open a file as a variable length record file for output. At the same time the file will be allocated.

3 MVS access method definition file

The access method definition file should be consulted for the description of the options and their default values. This includes the constraining values of the options. The access method definition file should also be consulted for the processing modes supported by the access method.

Refer to the recio library documentation for interpreting the contents of the access method definition file.

```
access mvs(using="binary", with);

4 Environment

The location and format of the access method definition file is required to be specified by the environment variable CODEMAGUS_AMDPATH. This environment variable supplies a pattern to the full path of where access method definition (or amd) files are located. The format of the environment variable is that of a path with a %s appearing in the position in which the access method member name should appear. For example, on MVS systems this might have the form:

```
CODEMAGUS_AMDPATH='DNCT00.SRDA1.AMDFILES(%s)'
```

On a Unix-based system, the value might be set in a shell profile file such as:

```
export CODEMAGUS_AMDPATH=$HOME/bin/%s.amd
```

On Windows systems, the value might be supplied from the environment variables and look something like:

```
C:\CodeMagus\bin\%s.amd
```
